EXHORTATION AND PRAYER

P: Dear people of God, in this Christmas season it is our duty and delight to hear again the message of the angels and, in heart and mind, to go to Bethlehem and see this thing which has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us—the Christ-Child lying in a manger.

Let us read and learn in Holy Scripture the story of the loving purposes of God from the first days after our fall into sin to the glorious redemption brought to us by this holy Child.

But first, let us pray for people all over the world who would delight with us to know the good news of Jesus Christ, and who would join with us in singing his praises. Let us pray for the people of this city and for all those in our own congregation.

And, because this would please our Lord, let us remember, in his name, the poor and helpless, the cold, the hungry and the oppressed, the sick and those who are sad, the lonely and the unloved, the elderly and the little children. We especially remember all those who do not know the Lord Jesus, or who do not love him, or who by sin have grieved his heart of love.

Finally, let us remember before God all those who rejoice with us in heaven, who live in greater light than we, that multitude which no one can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, who died in faith, and who live before the throne of God and praise him each day in his temple. We confess that we are united with them as we are united with one another.

To sum up all these petitions, let us pray as Christ himself taught us.

C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen




LESSON Isaiah 52:7-10

Second Lesson Hebrews 1:1-9

Don't be fooled by the lowliness. Be very glad that the Savior has come in the form and appearance of a little baby. But don't think that it all there is to it. Oh no, by no means! His lowliness keeps us from running away in dread and terror, for he wants us to draw near. Peer into the manger: there he is who is greater than all the angels, who is in fact their creator and the one whose praises they sing; there he is the Almighty, the Eternal God in the form of a baby; there he is the Holy One, the Only Begotten Son, who has come to conquer our wickedness and give us his holiness. Worship and adore!

Gospel John 1:1-14

Who is it that we receive in the manger of our heart this day? Not just a cute and cuddly baby! No, that lowliness of form is designed to make it possible for us to receive Light brighter than the sun, the Creator of all that is, the Eternal God, the Child who makes us God's children. As the manger and the Virgin's arms held him whom the heavens cannot contain, so we too recognize and receive him who has come in human flesh and blood to dwell in us through the Word and sacrament. It is in the Word and sacrament that we recognize him and receive him, the One who receives us.

M: Be a source of strength to all your people and fill them with your power and peace. If any are among us today who have lost the true meaning of this festival, let them rediscover the joy that comes from Christ alone.

C: Let your peace reign in the hearts of all.

M: As you sent your Son to bring peace to all people on earth, so we pray for all people, those known and those unknown to us.

C: We pray through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
