CRUCIAL HOURS

Lent begins with ASH WEDNESDAY on March 2. Historically, Christians celebrate and acknowledge the Lenten season because it focuses upon the details of Christ’s redemptive work. This 40 day period also reminds us of the horrible price that sin requires.

This year’s Lenten study is based on New Testament texts. The overall theme for 2022 Lenten sermons is titled: “CRUCIAL HOURS.” This series ponders key words and moments from the account of Jesus’ passion that demonstrate the thorough completeness of His saving work for us, the breath and depth of His love for us, and the strength of His union with us.

Please set aside some time for Midweek Lenten worship beginning on Wednesday, March 2 at 7 p.m. Here are the themes & texts:

March 9—**“A PART FOR A WHOLE”** - Luke 23:13-16

¹¹ But when Christ appeared as the high priest of the good things that were coming, he went through the greater and more complete tent, which was not made by human hands (that is, it is not part of this creation). ¹² He entered once into the Most Holy Place and obtained eternal redemption, not by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood. ¹³ Now if the blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer, sprinkled on those who were unclean, sanctifies them so that their flesh is clean, ¹⁴ how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works, so that we worship the living God? ¹⁵ For this reason, he is the mediator of a new covenant. A death took place as payment for the trespasses committed under the first covenant, so that those who are called would receive the promised eternal inheritance.
