M: Dear friends, God did not create Adam and Eve to die. But after our first parents sinned, God said that death would come to all people. Scripture tells us that just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, in this way death came to all, because all sinned. But God sent His one and only Son to become the sacrifice for the sins of the world. Christ gave Himself freely into death and rose again, that all who look up to Him in faith will have eternal life. In this way the Lord has had compassion on us. “For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead also comes through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive.” Therefore, death for the Christian is not the end of life but the beginning of eternal joy with Jesus in paradise.

Christ has raised from the dead and became the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. Now we know that when He returns “we will not all sleep, but we will be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

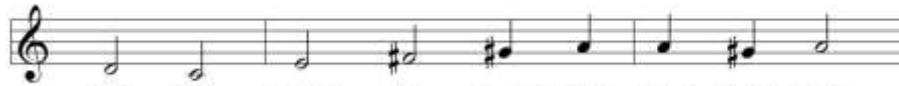

### **The Easter Prayer & Lord's Prayer**

**M:** O God of peace, who raised from the dead our Lord Jesus Christ, the great Shepherd of the sheep, we thank and praise you for the new life you have given us through his glorious resurrection. 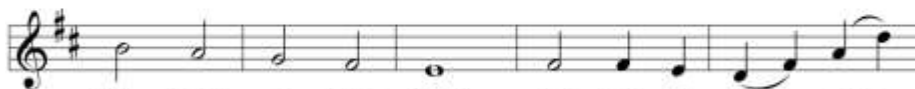

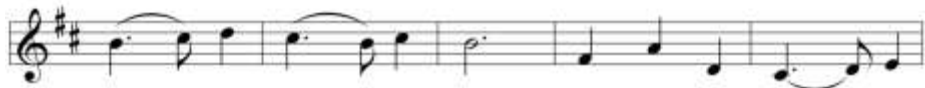
