WELCOME TO ZION. It is our hope and prayer that the message you hear today from God's Word will strengthen your faith and fill your heart with the peace only God can give and the joy we have in believing that JESUS CHRIST is our Savior from sin.

Worship Focus: Ash Wednesday is a day of repentance. We stand before God with broken and contrite hearts.

This is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday begins the Christian's Lenten journey with a reminder of our mortality and a call to repentance (Genesis 18:27; Job 42:6; Jeremiah 6:26; Matthew 11:21). The ancient practice of imposing ashes on the foreheads of the faithful gives Ash Wednesday its name. The church father Tertullian (c. A.D. 160 - 215) writes of the practice as a public expression of repentance and of our human frailty that stands in need of Christ. The ashes remind us forcefully of our need for redeeming grace as they recall words from the rite for Christian burial: '... earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust...,' words that will someday be spoken over us all. The imposition of ashes has never been an exclusively Roman Catholic practice and today is observed widely by Christians of many traditions.

OUR FAMILY AT WORSHIP

Preacher: Brothers and sisters in Christ, God created us to know joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. By our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judgment but to turn to him and live. Therefore, God in his mercy has sent our Lord Jesus Christ to take our place under the law, to suffer for us, and to die the death we deserve. God made Jesus, who had no sin, to be sin for us so that in him, we might become the righteousness of God.

During the 40 days of Lent, we fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of God. The time of Lent reminds us that to know Christ and the power of his resurrection, we must also know the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death.

As disciples of the Lord Jesus, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us from Him. I invite you, therefore, to confess your sins, ask our Father for forgiveness, and commit yourselves to this struggle. Let us pause now for a time of reflection and self-examination.

CONFESSION OF PSALM 51

(We confess responsively....)

Preacher: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. **Congregation: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against you,**

you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight,

P: so that you are proved right when you speak and justified when you judge. **C: Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me.**

P: Surely you desire truth in the inner parts; you teach me wisdom in the inmost place.

C: Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me.

P: O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings.

C: The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit. A broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

P: Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. **C: Hide your face from my sins and blot out my iniquity.**

P: Restore to me the joy of your salvation

C: and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me. Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will turn back to you.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES


The congregation is invited to come forward at the direction of the ushers to make a small cross with ashes on the banner.

ABSOLUTION IS PROCLAIMED

Following the practice of the imposition of ashes, the minister speaks the words of absolution to the congregation, saying:

M: Although the ashes remind us of sin and our mortality, it is in the shape of the cross so that we remember that Lent is not just a time of contrition, but more important, it is a time for emphasizing the forgiveness from God. The ashes remind us of sin, but the cross reminds us of the grace that has overcome that sin.

Therefore, in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all yours sins in the name of the Father, and of the 🕆 Son, and of the Holy Spirit. You are no more a child of ashes but a child of God. May God give you strength to live as his dear children! Amen.

P: Let us pray.

P: Almighty and merciful God, you never despise what you have made and always forgive those who turn to you. Create in us such new and contrite hears that we may truly repent pf our sins and obtain your full and gracious pardon; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



THE WORD

First Lesson

2 Samuel 12:1-13

12 So the LORD sent Nathan to David. He came and told him this: There were two men in a city. One was rich and one poor. ²The rich man had a large number of flocks and herds. ³The poor man did not own anything except one little ewe lamb, which he had bought. He raised it so that it grew up together with him and his children. It ate from his food and drank from his cup. It slept in his arms. It was like a daughter to him. ⁴ When a traveler came to the rich man, the rich man was unwilling to take an animal from his flock or from his herd to prepare a meal for the traveler who had come to him. So he took the lamb from the poor man and prepared it for the man who had come to him. ⁵David's anger flared up against that man. He said to Nathan, "As the LORD lives, the man who has done this is as good as dead. ⁶ In place of that lamb, he will restore four lambs, because he did this and had no pity." ⁷Nathan told David, "You are the man." This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says. "I anointed you king over Israel. I rescued you from the hand of Saul. ⁸I gave the house of your master to you, and I gave the wives of your master into your embrace. I gave you the house of Israel and the house of Judah. If this was too little, I would have added even more. "Why have you despised the word of the LORD by doing evil in his eyes? You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword. You have taken his wife as your own wife. You have killed him with the sword of the Ammonites. ¹⁰ So now the sword will not depart from your house forever, because you have despised me and have taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your wife. ¹¹ This is what the LORD says. Look! I am raising up disaster against you from your own house. Right in front of your eyes I will take your wives and give them to your neighbor, and he will lie down with your wives in the sight of the sun. ¹² Because you acted in secret, I will do this in front of all Israel in broad daylight. ¹³ David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." Nathan said to David, "The LORD himself has put away your sin. You will not die. (EHV)

We urge you, on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. ²¹ God made him, who did not know sin, to become sin for us, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him. **6** As fellow workers we also urge you not to receive God's grace in vain. ² For he says: At a favorable time I listened to you, and in the day of salvation I helped you. Look, now is the favorable time! See, now is the day of salvation! (EHV)

VERSE OF THE DAY


P: Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love. (Joel 2:13 cf. RSV)

GOSPEL:

Luke 18:9-14

⁹ Jesus told this parable to certain people who trusted in themselves (that they were righteous) and looked down on others: ¹⁰ "Two men went up to the temple courts to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a tax collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee stood and prayed about himself like this: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people, robbers, evildoers, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ¹² I fast twice a week. I give a tenth of all my income.' ¹³ "However the tax collector stood at a distance and would not even lift his eyes up to heaven, but was beating his chest and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' ¹⁴ "I tell you, this man went home justified rather than the other, because everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." SERMON TEXT AND THEME:

Job 40:1-2, 42:1-6

40 The LORD responded to Job and said: ² Will the one who makes charges against the Almighty dare to correct him? The one who accuses God should make his case!

42 Job responded to the LORD. He said: ²I know that you can do all things. No purpose of yours can be thwarted. ³ You asked, "Who is this who spreads darkness over my plans with his ignorant words?" I have made statements about things I did not understand, things too wonderful for me to know. ⁴ You said, "Listen now and I will speak. I will ask you questions, and you will inform me." ⁵ My ear heard about you. Now my eyes see you. ⁶ So I despise myself. I repent in dust and ashes.

Accusations

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

- P: Holy and righteous God, as we begin again the solemn spiritual journey of Lent, we come before you in deep humility. We confess that we are sinners, both by the nature we inherit and by the sinful thoughts and desires, words and actions that nature produces. Because of our sins, we deserve only your wrath and punishment. Yet you reveal yourself, not only as a God of holiness and justice but as a God of mercy and love. Despairing of our own merits and worthiness, and in response to your gracious invitation, we come pleading for your forgiveness.
- C: Lord, have mercy on us for your holy name's sake.
- P: You have revealed your love and mercy for us sinners in Jesus Christ, your Son, our Savior. You sent him into our world to be the atoning sacrifice for the sins of all people. Help us grasp by faith the great truth that the pain and suffering, the mockery and ridicule, and the death and punishment he endured should have been ours. Help us understand that in incomprehensible love he suffered and died for us.
- C: Lord, have mercy on us for Jesus' sake.

P: In silent meditation let us reflect on our sins, praise our Savior for the forgiveness he has won for us, and ask for God's continued grace to remove any doubt that we are forgiven.

Time for silent meditation follows.

P: God of grace and mercy, may your Spirit continue to be with us as we follow the way of the cross. As we contemplate the story of our Savior's passion, build us up in our faith. Renew in us the zeal to serve you by reflecting your love in our lives. Give us the desire and the ability to boldly proclaim the grace in which we stand, so that all for whom you lived and died may join us in fellowship now and in your presence forever.

C: We offer our humble thanks and praise, our prayers and petitions, and ourselves in body and spirit to





O CHRIST, LAMB OF GOD





VOTER'S MEETING— A call meeting was held on Sunday, January 28th. Zion has extended a call to Benjamin Workentine. Please pray as he deliberates his call.

BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP:

Dear Members of Zion,

Since the Capital Campaign kicked off in April of 2022 Zion has received just over \$200,000 in major gifts and weekly offerings, what a blessing!

The funds have been used for a number of improvements including:

- New furniture has been purchased for the west foyer
- A new security system has been installed. This project included the installation of multiple cameras on the property, both inside and outside of the building, a keyless entry system, and more
- Generator backup switches have been installed on each church own parsonage/teacherage
- Professional design services for handicap bathroom remodeling plans
- Miscellaneous repairs to church owned properties

The Voters approved the following items in order of priority:

- Electric panel replacements (two panels at ~\$6,160 per panel)
- Tunnel water issues with mold remediation if found necessary
- Parking lot repair (patch and seal)
- Basement handicap access (lift)
- Backup power generator for the church and school

There is currently \$2,874.39 available that is not committed to a certain project. If you are moved to give to the capital campaign, please **mark your donations as "Capital Campaign".**
