

FIRST LESSON

Acts14:8-18

⁸ In Lystra there was a man who was sitting down because he had no strength in his feet. He had never walked because he was lame from birth. ⁹ When he was listening to Paul as he was speaking, Paul looked at him closely and saw that he had faith to be healed. ¹⁰ Paul said in a loud voice, "Stand up on your feet!" And the man jumped up and began to walk. ¹¹ When the crowds saw what Paul had done, they raised their voices, saying in the Lycaonian language, "The gods have come down to us in human form." ¹² Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul they called Hermes, because he was the main speaker. ¹³ The priest of Zeus, whose temple was just outside the city, brought bulls and garlands to the city gates, because he wanted to offer sacrifices along with the crowds. ¹⁴ But when the apostles Paul and Barnabas heard about this, they tore their clothes and rushed into the crowd, shouting, ¹⁵ "Men, why are you doing these things? We too are men with the same nature as you. We are preaching the good news to you so that you turn from these worthless things to the living God, who made the heaven, the earth, the sea, and everything in them. ¹⁶ In past generations he allowed all the nations to go their own ways. ¹⁷ Yet he did not leave himself without testimony of the good he does. He gives you rain from heaven and crops in their seasons. He fills you with food and fills your hearts with gladness." ¹⁸ Even though they said these things, they had a hard time stopping the crowds from sacrificing to them. (EHV)

Dear Members of Zion,

What a beautiful facility we have been blessed with to worship our Lord and Savior! Zion was built in 1969, over 50 years ago, and has served our church well. But, decades of use with limited updates has left us with a few projects that need some tending to.

In addition to the regular upkeep of church, school and church owned properties there are a number of larger capital improvement projects coming our way in 2022 and 2023. The improvements include a major update to the restrooms to make them handicap accessible, an updated security system, roof repair/replacement, standby backup generator and possible relocation of the school and church offices. Please know that this list is not exhaustive.

These are all very exciting projects that will serve Zion well for many years. The cost for all the projects are unknown at this time as we gather estimates. The projects are seeded by two estate gifts totaling approximately \$80,000.

The Board of Stewardship is kicking off a capital campaign with the goal of raising funds for capital improvements. Please consider giving to these important projects and mark your donations as "Capital Campaign".
