WELCOME TO ZION. It is our hope and prayer that the message you hear today from God's Word will strengthen your faith and fill your heart with the peace only God can give and the joy we have in believing that JESUS CHRIST is our Savior from sin.

This is the first Sunday in the season of Easter. The Easter season lasts fifty days, seven Sundays. During these fifty days, the lessons will show us the risen Christ and the effect his triumph over death and the grave has in our lives.

WORSHIP NOTES

Our Worship Theme: He is Risen!

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Sinners should fear God. Sinners ought to die for their wickedness. The grave should be the place of ultimate defeat for mankind. Yet on this day, the Second Adam did all that the first had left undone. Bearing our guilt and suffering our verdict, the Son of Man died, but three days later he rose in glory. As a result, fear is gone, mankind is redeemed, and Christ calls us his own brothers. Jesus came from death to life, and through baptism he brings us with him.

The Hymn of the Day: Awake, My Heart, with Gladness

The Hymn of the Day is a key element in the service. The practice of having a chief hymn for the day in the service has roots deep in historical, liturgical Lutheran worship tradition. Its purpose is to respond closely to the theme of the day.

Today's hymn shows that because Christ died and then rose from death, we too, when we die, will rise to eternal life. This is the confidence and the joy of the Christian, and the reason we follow him through good and bad times.

P: Shouts of joy and victory resound in the tents of the righteous:

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS:

C: As for us, we were dead in our transgressions and sins, in which we used to live when we followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our sinful nature and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature objects of wrath.

P: But because of his great love for you, God, who is rich in mercy, made you alive with Christ even when you were dead in transgressions - it is by grace you have been saved. And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith -and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast.

C: For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

P: Your sins are forgiven, there is peace between you and God. Amen.

The Second Lesson: 1 Corinthians 15:19-26

If death was all that we had to look forward to, then we would be miserable indeed. We would have reason to fear that our whole life was in vain and the endurance of every struggle or temptation a wasted effort. If death ends all, why struggle, why sacrifice, why endure opposition and persecution especially from our own flesh in its fight with sins and temptations? But death does not end all. Death, feared by all, has now fallen victim to Christ in his resurrection; he has conquered it for us! We will rise. We will see him as he is. We will spend eternity not in dust but in adoration. That's why he came. That's why he died. That's why we are so glad on this most holy day of days. Therefore do not be afraid of life. Fear death even less. For Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! His life is our life, our death is his death, his resurrection and his heaven are our future!

The Holy Gospel: Mark 16:1-8

What were the women afraid of? It is interesting to note that they have triumphed over all kinds of fears at the beginning of the gospel lesson, but they are overcome by fear at its close, at least temporarily. What do we have to be afraid of? They could have feared the soldiers. We may be afraid of people who hate the church or hate us. They could have been afraid of what they did not understand. We could too, for who grasps the invisible power of God or understands death and clearly "sees" what follows it? They could have been afraid of God, calling to mind their own earlier sins and doubts. We surely can sympathize with them in that! But the empty tomb and the angel of the resurrection says to all of our fears, Don't be afraid! He is risen, *just as he promised!* Now we can be sure that he will keep all of his promises. For if he kept this one, then nothing will be too hard for him, and nothing will hold him back from his assurance to us of his grace, his protection in life and death, his promise even of our resurrection.!

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

P: Almighty and merciful God, on this glorious day we rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Increase our faith that the grace of the empty tomb may fill our lives and make us glad each day.

C: When we are weak be our strength, when we are sad be our song, and when we sin be our salvation.

P: Remove the disgrace of death from all who mourn. In moments of grief call believers through the voice of our Good Shepherd, and embolden us to follow his promises. In their hopelessness of despair turn the faithless to trust in the only Way, Truth, and Life.

C: Wipe away tears born of death, and give new birth to a living hope in the hearts of the lost and troubled. Use our witness as compassion and comfort for others in need of mercy.

P: King of kings and Lord of lords, destroy all dominion, authority, and power that stands against you, whether seen or unseen. Whatever evil exerts itself against your saving will – false teaching or lukewarm faith, Satan’s lies or worldly pleasures, empty worship or futile religion – rule it for the sake of the gospel’s free course.

C: Wherever we live and whatever we do, help us to be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks us to give the reason for the hope that we have in Christ.

P: Heavenly Father keep the baptized united with your Son in his resurrection. Put to death the fleshly urges of those caught in addictions, clothe in your righteousness anyone ashamed of good intentions which have fallen short, and assure those searching for purpose that their eternal identity as your dear children is sealed.

C: Thank you for the power of baptism working in our lives, and for the certainty of its promises through the resurrection. Enrich us with everything we need for life and godliness.

P: O Lord of life, you have done mighty things for us! We pray through him who is the Beginning and the End, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

C: His name is above every name, to the glory of God the Father! Amen.
