HOLY WEEK-WHAT A WEEK!

From the Pastor



Pick a week in someone's life and study it's significance. Would you look at their 1st week, their birth and subsequent list of 1st time experiences? Would you focus in on their baptism or confirmation? How about graduation? What about getting married or having children? Did you think about the last week of someone's life and what note-worthy accomplishments they made?

When you think about Jesus, what week could be more important than Holy Week? Palm Sunday, He enters into Jerusalem, knowing all that lays before Him to finish God's plan of salvation. Maundy Thursday, He celebrates the Pass-over, after washing the disciples feet. Then Christ institutes the Lord's Supper. From there, Jesus goes to the Garden of Gethsemene to pray. Judas betrays Jesus. And the Son of Man is taken into custody by the Jewish religious leaders. They will find Him guilty and hand Him over to Pontius Pilate demanding that Jesus be executed. Pilate knows Jesus is innocent but does not know how to free Him. After being abused by Roman soldiers, Jesus is crucified and put to death. He dies on Good Friday. His life-less body is laid to rest and sealed in a tomb. But on Sunday morning, Jesus' body is no longer in the tomb because He is alive.

Can you think of a week with greater impact and significance than Holy Week?

Principal's Report for April 2021 Messenger

Ups and downs. Most everyone can describe this last year as having many ups and downs.

For Jesus on his final week before his suffering, death, and resurrection, it was also a week of ups and downs. Entering Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to the worship and adoration of crowds shouting "Hosanna!" ("Save us now!") To his intimate final Passover meal with his disciples on that Thursday, then a garden visit of fervent prayer ending in betrayal by a friend, an arrest, a mock trial and an undeserved death sentence, beating, scorn, and death by crucifixion. Yet a victory won for us – "It is finished.", and one Sunday later a glorious resurrection on displaying Jesus victory over death.

What brought Jesus through it all was his singular purpose, the salvation of his people from sin – not just those alive in his time, but believers in God's promises throughout history, all the way down to you and I. This is evident in the words he prayed in Gethsemane:

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one— I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me." – John 17:20-23

Jesus knew what was about to happen. He knew that it was necessary to complete God's plan of salvation. How amazing that there in the garden, almost 2000 years ago, he was thinking of us – those who would believe in him through the message brought from the apostles down through the ages to generation after generation of believers.

What a privilege we have to continue bringing the message to the next generation through our church's ministry, and through Zion Lutheran School, sharing the message of the Gospel to young hearts on a daily basis, and assisting parents by providing the God's Word and a Christian environment that nurture's the growing faith of the students in our care, preparing them to stand firm in that faith in this sin-darkened world. May God give us the same single minded spirit as we continue to utilize the opportunities to share his message of salvation through all of the ups and downs.

This spring brings us to the completion of our school year, and a thankfulness that God has kept our school family healthy and allowed us to maintain in-person learning for our children throughout the school year. We have opened enrollment and are excited to already be enrolling new students for the 2021-2022 school year. We just completed our basketball season and now look forward to spring activities. We are excited to bookend the week of April 18-24 with two special activities: On Sunday, April 18 we will be holding our CEA Auction, and on Friday and Saturday, April 23 and 24, the students of Zion will be presenting a school musical, *It's Cool in the Furnace*. We look forward to this opportunity for our children to use their gifts to God's glory. Both events will be held outdoors in an event tent in the school yard to allow for greater participation.

³⁵ But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body will they come?" ³⁶ How foolish! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. ³⁷ When you sow, you do not plant the body that will be, but just a seed, perhaps of wheat or of something else. ³⁸ But God gives it a body as he has determined, and to each kind of seed he gives its own body. ³⁹ Not all flesh is the same: People have one kind of flesh, animals have another, birds another and fish another. ⁴⁰ There are also heavenly bodies and there are earthly bodies; but the splendor of the heavenly bodies is one kind, and the splendor of the earthly bodies is another. ⁴¹ The sun has one kind of splendor, the moon another and the stars another; and star differs from star in splendor. ⁴² So will it be with the resurrection of the dead. The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable; ⁴³ it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; ⁴⁴ it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body. ⁴⁵ So it is written: "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam, a life-giving spirit. ⁴⁶ The spiritual did not come first, but the natural, and after that the spiritual. ⁴⁷ The first man was of the dust of the earth; the second man is of heaven. ⁴⁸ As was the earthly man, so are those who are of the earth; and as is the heavenly man, so also are those who are of heaven. ⁴⁹ And just as we have borne the image of the earthly man, so shall we bear the image of the heavenly man.

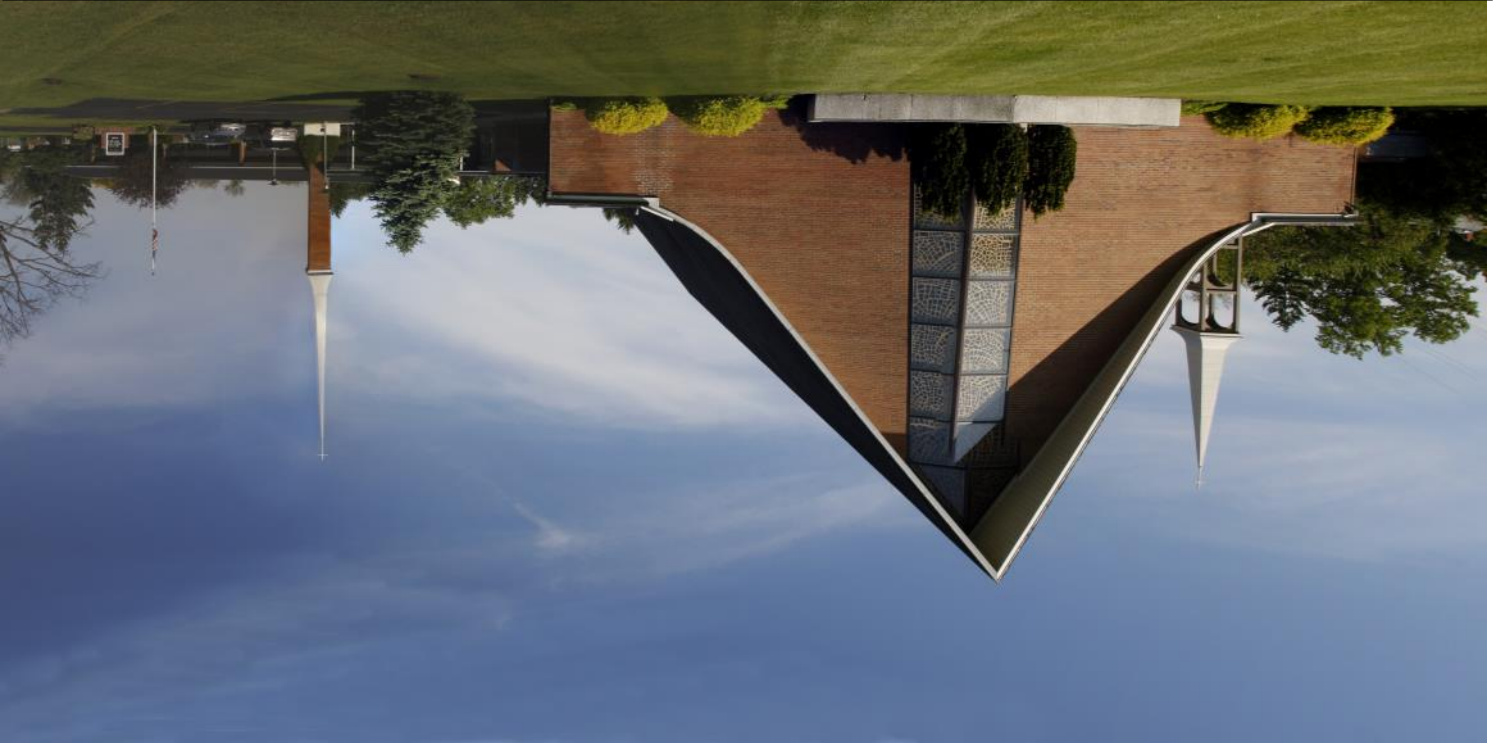
