Sunday, January 17 0 Gifts of Myrrh

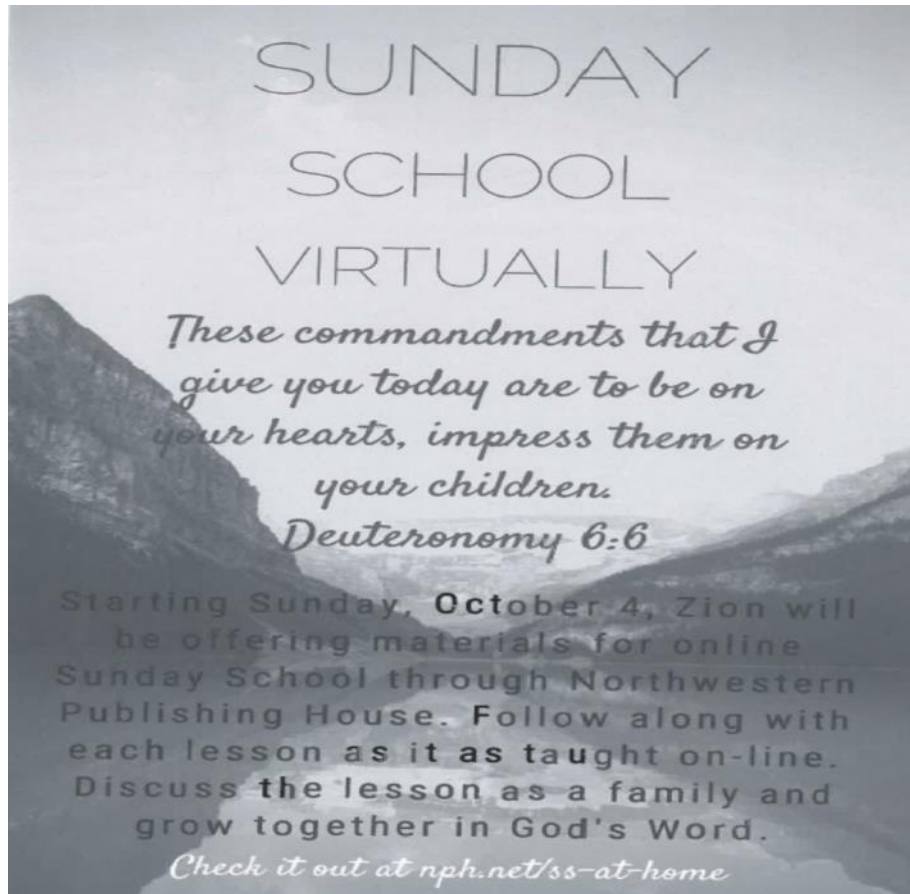

### Section 107-2011

#### 2021 Parsonage Allowance Resolution

The following resolution was duly adopted by the church council at a scheduled meeting on December 17, 2020, a quorum being present:

Whereas, section 107 of the Internal Revenue Code specifies that the amount of ministers' compensation that is designated in advance by their employing church as a housing allowance is not taxable in computing federal income taxes to the extent that it is used to pay for actual expenses incurred in owning or renting a home (and for ministers who live in a parsonage and who pay some of their housing expenses) Those ministers who own their own home must not exceed the fair rental value of the home; and

Whereas, Pastor Ross Ulrich is compensated by Zion Lutheran Church exclusively for services as minister, and

Whereas, teachers Bryan Schneck & Kurt Nielsen are compensated by Zion Lutheran Church exclusively for services as teachers (ministers of the Gospel)

## CHURCH COUNCIL & BOARDS

1 After Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, when Herod was king, Wise Men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked, <sup>2</sup>“Where is he who has been born King of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.” <sup>3</sup>When King Herod heard this, he was alarmed, and all Jerusalem with him. <sup>4</sup>He gathered together all the people’s chief priests and experts in the law. He asked them where the Christ was to be born. <sup>5</sup>They said to him, “In Bethlehem of Judea, because this was written through the prophet: <sup>6</sup>You, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are certainly not least among the rulers of Judah: because out of you will come a ruler, who will shepherd my people, Israel.” <sup>7</sup>Then Herod secretly summoned the Wise Men and found out from them exactly when the star had appeared. <sup>8</sup>He sent them to Bethlehem and said, “Go and search carefully for the child. When you find him, report to me, so that I may also go and worship him.” <sup>9</sup>After listening to the king, they went on their way. Then the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them, until it stood still over the place where the child was. <sup>10</sup>When they saw the star, they rejoiced with overwhelming joy. <sup>11</sup>After they went into the house and saw the child with Mary, his mother, they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.
