- P: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (\$\frac{1}{3}\$) and of the Holy Spirit.

P: For the well-being of your holy Church in all the world and for those who offer here their worship and praise, hear our prayer, O Lord.





NICENE CREED

P: Lift up your hearts.




P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION



O CHRIST, LAMB OF GOD







Dear Members of Zion,

Did you know that we have a capital campaign going on RIGHT NOW?

Within the past 14 months Zion has received two estate gifts totaling approximately \$80,000 and an additional \$25,000 through member offerings. These donations have helped seed a couple exciting projects and complete others. A list of projects that have been completed include:

- New furniture has been purchased for the west foyer (some furniture still pending delivery)
- A new security system has been installed. This project included the installation of multiple cameras on the property, both inside and outside of the building, a keyless entry system, and more
- Generator backup switches have been installed on each church own parsonage/teacherage
- Professional design services for handicap bathroom remodeling plans
- Miscellaneous repairs to church owned properties

Here is a list of projects that will be approved **as the funds are available.** It is important to note that the current plan is to only pursue these projects once funds are collected through the capital campaign. This will remain true unless the repair becomes urgent or emergency in nature.

- A major update to the restrooms to make them handicap accessible
- A backup generator allowing worship services and school to continue during times without power
- Repair and/or replacement of the roof


