**Do not say, “Why were the former days better than these?”
Wisdom would not lead you to ask such a question.
Ecclesiastes 7:10**

AULD ANG SYNE

A fine and famous New Year’s song asks: “Should old acquaintance be forget and never brought to mind?”

No, of course not! It’s natural at year’s end, to remember people, events, routines, and occasions from the past. The trouble is that memory is not always very accurate. We tend to enhance good things in the past. Good times become better. Hard times lose their edge. Many times, someone, inspired by their memory, will long for the “good old days.”

An experienced and divinely—inspired Solomon records this in God’s Word:

**Do not say, “Why were the former days better than these?”
Wisdom would not lead you to ask such a question.**

The Lord, through Solomon, does not command us to forget the past. For forgetfulness is the first step to unfaithfulness.

What our gracious God doesn’t want us to do (for our own benefit) is to put the wrong appraisal on the past. As some exaggerate the past, God’s blessings were more or better in comparison to today. And today’s trials are more difficult than those of yesterday.

We deceive ourselves if we believe that. It used to be easier to live before than it is today—WRONG. We undermine our faith if we figure that the Lord took better care of us and others before. Sin has always carried with it the same destructive and deadly effects in all the time periods. But then again, the Lord’s grace and mercy has also had the same power and influence in all time periods.

Today it’s COVID; in the 1990’s it was AIDS; in the 1300’s it was the Bubonic plague. The Bubonic plague (Black Death) killed over 1/4 of Europe’s population.

2022 Parsonage Allowance Resolution

The following resolution was duly adopted by the church council at a scheduled meeting on December 16, 2021, a quorum being present:

Whereas, section 107 of the Internal Revenue Code specifies that the amount of ministers' compensation that is designated in advance by their employing church as a housing allowance is not taxable in computing federal income taxes to the extent that it is used to pay for actual expenses incurred in owning or renting a home (and for ministers who live in a parsonage and who pay some of their housing expenses) Those ministers who own their own home must not exceed the fair rental value of the home; and

Whereas, Pastor Ross Ulrich is compensated by Zion Lutheran Church exclusively for services as minister

Whereas, teachers Bryan Schneck & Ryan Roth are compensated by Zion Lutheran Church exclusively for services as teachers (ministers of the Gospel)

Therefore, it is resolved that of the amount paid for 2022 as listed below, includes the amount hereby designated as a housing allowance.
