PRINCIPAL REPORT



Principal's Report – January Zion Messenger

"Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." – Matthew 2:2

I have always loved the story of the magi, or wise men. Historically, we know so very little about them. Though the traditional song about them gives a lot of details, in truth the Bible gives us very little information. We really don't know how many there were, where exactly they came from (other than "the east"), or how long exactly it took for them to reach Bethlehem. What we do know is that, through a sign in the heavens and some exposure to Old Testament prophecies, it was revealed to them that the Messiah was born, and that he was important enough for them to make a journey to see him and present some very precious gifts. Perhaps the reason I've always felt a close connection to their part of the story is the things we have in common with them. They were Gentiles (non-Jews), and so are we. Gentiles were not the chosen people of the promise, yet through Jesus's redeeming work they (and we) are part of the "all nations" to be blessed with the gift of salvation. Our knowledge of the promised Savior like theirs came not from an angelic announcement, but the revelation of God's Word. Through the Holy Spirit, that same Word works on the hearts of God's people to continue to seek him out and be near him today.

Though it does not tell us in the Scriptures, I can imagine that, like the shepherds, the magi did not keep their knowledge to themselves, but continued to share their excitement and joy. Why wouldn't they? As we finish up our Christmas season, put away our decorations, and enter a new year, I pray that we may continue to share the joy of our salvation through Jesus with those around us as we continue telling the story of Jesus that started in Bethlehem but ended with a cross, an empty tomb, and a fulfilled promise to all who believe.

We enjoyed the story retold by our preschool classes and our grades K-8 students as they presented their messages of our Savior's birth at our preschool and elementary school Christmas services on December 21st. What a great opportunity for our students to do "shepherds' and angels' work" sharing the good news of great joy for all people with our church and school family, as well as other family and friends. Thank you, Zion students and teachers, for sharing your Christmas joy!

Beside our Christmas preparations, the co-ed basketball teams assembled and began their practices in December. Coaches Steve Sordahl and Ryan Roth are preparing grades 3-8 students in three teams: C (grade 3-4), B (grades 5-6) and A (grades 7-8). With our smaller classes we will have some overlap within the teams and plenty of action for our players. We thank the coaches for their work as they prep our Warriors for the upcoming season. Pee Wee Poms and Cheerleading will start practices in January, with Mrs. Stacey Sordahl coaching. Our A team will participate in their first games at an HVL pre-season tournament on January 7th, and our first home game will be on January 27th. A big thank you also goes out to our Zion CEA, as our basketball teams and cheerleaders will be sporting new uniforms for this season, provided by the CEA.

The students and families at Zion again hosted a “giving tree” again this year for the residents and those served by Paula’s House. The gifts were much appreciated by Paula’s House residents. In January we plan to participate in St. Jude’s “Math-a-thon”, with students having the opportunity to practice their math skills while raising funds for St. Jude’s children’s Research Hospital.

Students and teachers alike enjoyed a rest as classes recessed from December 22nd through January 4th for the Christmas holiday. Classes resume on January 5th.

January 13th will mark the end of our 2nd quarter and the halfway point for our school year.

As we look forward to the new year that God has planned for us, we appreciate our school family, and especially our parents who recognize how important the knowledge of Jesus and his gift of salvation for us is to their children’s educational and spiritual development, and that they are willing to use their gifts to support Christian education. We are very pleased with the continued success of our preschool and K-8 programs, and our school board is working on plans to continue the current momentum of growth into the future. We know that God has us in his hand and will continue to provide as we place our trust in him.

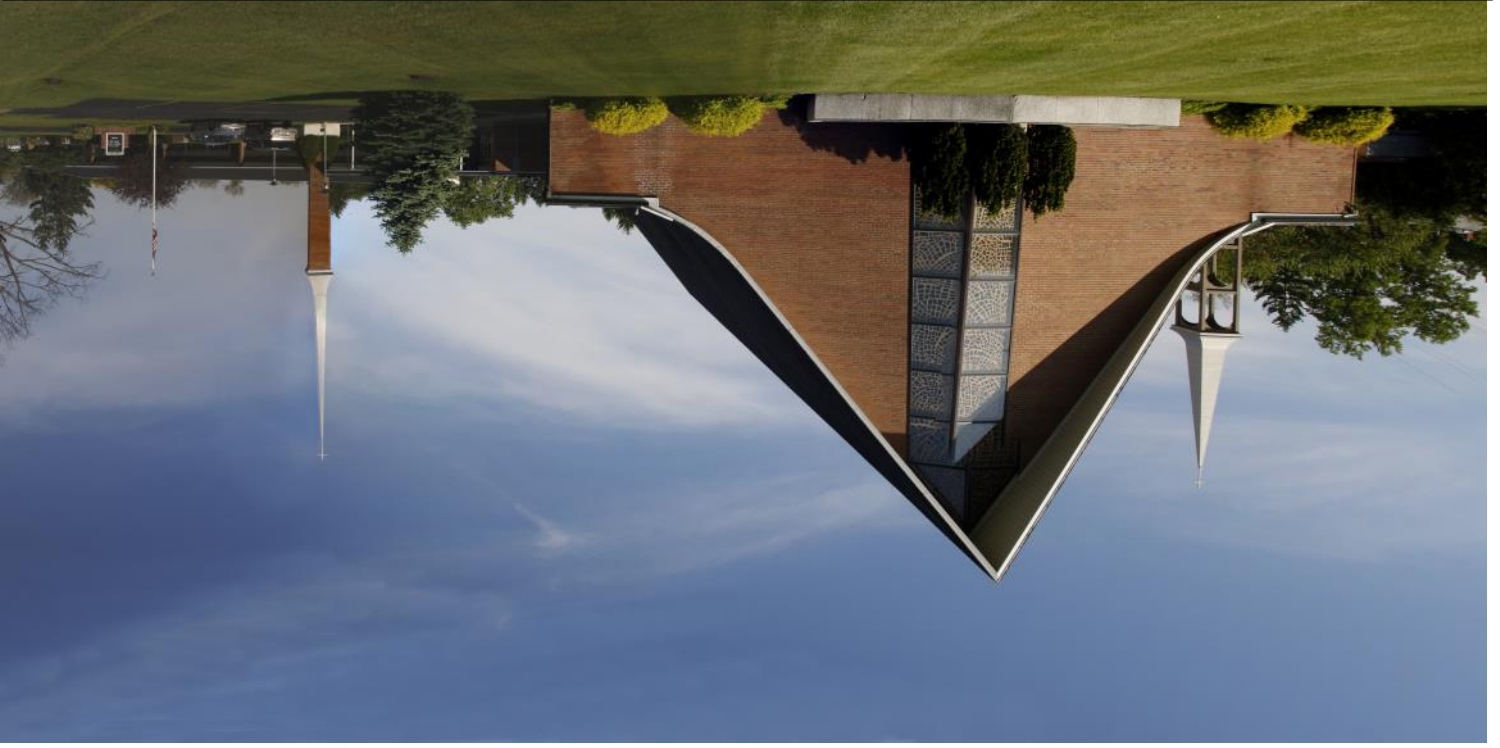
