
### First Lesson

**Acts:15, 16a, 26-33**

<sup>15</sup> After the reading of the Law and the Prophets, the leaders of the synagogue sent a message to them, saying, “Gentlemen, brothers, if you have a word of encouragement for the people, say it.”

<sup>16</sup> Then Paul stood up, motioned with his hand, and said, “Men of Israel and you who fear God, listen.

<sup>26</sup> “Gentlemen, brothers, sons of Abraham’s family, and those among you who fear God, this message of salvation has been sent to you. <sup>27</sup> The people of Jerusalem and their rulers did not recognize him, and by condemning him they fulfilled the statements of the prophets that are read every Sabbath. <sup>28</sup> Though they found no grounds for a death sentence, they asked Pilate to have him executed. <sup>29</sup> When they carried out everything that was written about him, they took him down from the cross and laid him in a tomb. <sup>30</sup> But God raised him from the dead, <sup>31</sup> and for many days he was seen by those who had come up with him from Galilee to Jerusalem. These same individuals are now his witnesses to the people. <sup>32</sup> “We are preaching to you the good news about the promise that was made to our fathers. <sup>33</sup> God has fulfilled this promise for us, their children, by raising up Jesus. 



Registration for the 2022-2023 school year is underway. Zion has two accounts to help those who have a financial need attend Zion Lutheran School. The funds are 9524, this is the general ZLS tuition assistance and is open to all students and 9530 which is only available to Zion members for ZLS tuition assistance.

#### **STEWARDSHIP NOTES:**

Dear Members of Zion,

What a beautiful facility we have been blessed with to worship our Lord and Savior! Zion was built in 1969, over 50 years ago, and has served our church well. But, decades of use with limited updates has left us with a few projects that need some tending to.

In addition to the regular upkeep of church, school and church owned properties there are a number of larger capital improvement projects coming our way in 2022 and 2023. The improvements include a major update to the restrooms to make them handicap accessible, an updated security system, roof repair/replacement, standby backup generator and possible relocation of the school and church offices. Please know that this list is not exhaustive.

These are all very exciting projects that will serve Zion well for many years. The cost for all the projects are unknown at this time as we gather estimates. The projects are seeded by two estate gifts totaling approximately \$80,000.


