Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.




#### THE WORD

FIRST LESSON Genesis 28:10-17

<sup>10</sup> Jacob set out from Beersheba and traveled toward Haran. <sup>11</sup> He came to a certain place and decided to spend the night there, because the sun had set. He took one of the stones from that place, put it under his head, and lay down to sleep in that place. <sup>12</sup> He had a dream in which he saw a stairway set up on the earth with its top reaching to heaven. There were angels of God ascending and descending on it. <sup>13</sup> There at the top stood the LORD, who said, "I am the LORD, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac. The land on which you are lying, I give to you and to your descendants. <sup>14</sup> Your descendants will be like the dust of the earth, and you will spread abroad to the west, and to the east, and to the north, and to the south. In you and in your seed all the families of the earth will be blessed. <sup>15</sup> Now, I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back again into this land. Indeed, I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised to you." <sup>16</sup> Jacob woke up from his sleep, and he said, "Certainly the LORD is in this place, and I was not aware of it." <sup>17</sup> He was afraid and he said, "How awe- inspiring is this place! This is nothing other than the house of God, and this is the gate to heaven. (EHV)

Second Lesson Romans 5:1-11

5 Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>2</sup> Through him we also have obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand. And we rejoice confidently on the basis of our hope for the glory of God. <sup>3</sup> Not only this, but we also rejoice confidently in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces patient endurance, <sup>4</sup> and patient endurance produces tested character, and tested character produces hope. <sup>5</sup> And hope will not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, who was given to us. <sup>6</sup> For at the appointed time, while we were still helpless, Christ died for the ungodly. <sup>7</sup> It is rare indeed that someone will die for a righteous person. Perhaps someone might actually go so far as to die for a person who has been good to him. <sup>8</sup> But God shows his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. <sup>9</sup> Therefore, since we have now been justified by his blood, it is even more certain that we will be saved from God's wrath through him. <sup>10</sup> For if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, it is even more certain that, since we have been reconciled, we will be saved by his life. <sup>11</sup> And not only is this so, but we also go on rejoicing confidently in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received this reconciliation. (EHV)

#### VERSE OF THE DAY

P: Jesus humbled himself and became obedient to death, even death on a cross. (Philippians 2:8b cf. NIV)

GOSPEL: Matthew 26:57-75

<sup>57</sup> Those who had arrested Jesus led him away to Caiaphas, the high priest, where the experts in the law and the elders were assembled. 58 Peter was following him at a distance and went as far as the courtyard of the high priest. He went inside and sat down with the guards to see how it would turn out. 59 The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for false testimony against Jesus so that they could put him to death. <sup>60</sup> They found none, even though many false witnesses came forward. Finally two came forward <sup>61</sup> and said, "This fellow said, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and rebuild it in three days." 62 The high priest stood up and said to him, "Have you no answer? What is this that these men are testifying against you?" <sup>63</sup> But Jesus remained silent. Then the high priest said to him, "I place you under oath by the living God: Tell us if you are the Christ, the Son of God!" <sup>64</sup> Jesus said to him, "It is as you have said. But I tell you, soon you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of power and coming on the clouds of heaven."  $^{65}$  Then the high priest tore his robes and said, "He has spoken blasphemy! Why do we need any more witnesses? See, you have just heard the blasphemy! 66 What do you think?" They answered, "He is deserving of death!" 67 Then they spit in his face and punched him. Some slapped him <sup>68</sup> and said, "Prophesy to us, Christ! Who hit you?" 69 Meanwhile Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard. A servant girl came to him and said, "You were also with Jesus the Galilean." 70 But he denied it in front of everyone, saying, "I don't know what you're talking about." 71 When Peter went out to the entryway, someone else saw him and said to those who were there, "This fellow was with Jesus of Nazareth." 72 Again Peter denied it with an oath and said, "I do not know the man." 73 After a little while those who stood by came and said to Peter, "Surely you are also one of them because even your accent gives you away." <sup>74</sup> Then he began to curse and to swear, "I do not know the man!" Just then the rooster crowed. 75 And Peter remembered the word Jesus had spoken, "Before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times." And he went outside and wept bitterly. (EHV)


#### PRAYER OF THE DAY


#### PRAYER FOR GRACE



#### **BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP:**

Dear Members of Zion,

Since the Capital Campaign kicked off in April of 2022 Zion has received just over \$200,000 in major gifts and weekly offerings, what a blessing!

The funds have been used for a number of improvements including:

- New furniture has been purchased for the west foyer
- A new security system has been installed. This project included the installation of multiple cameras on the property, both inside and outside of the building, a keyless entry system, and more
- Generator backup switches have been installed on each church own parsonage/teacherage
- Professional design services for handicap bathroom remodeling plans
- Miscellaneous repairs to church owned properties

The Voters approved the following items in order of priority:

- Electric panel replacements (two panels at ~\$6,160 per panel)
- Tunnel water issues with mold remediation if found necessary
- Parking lot repair (patch and seal)
- Basement handicap access (lift)
- Backup power generator for the church and school

There is currently \$2,874.39 available that is not committed to a certain project. If you are moved to give to the capital campaign, please **mark your donations as "Capital Campaign".**
