³⁰ Then they asked him, "So what miraculous sign are you going to do, that we may see it and believe you? What miraculous sign are you going to perform?" ³¹ Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, just as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'" ³² Jesus said to them, "Amen, Amen, I tell you: Moses did not give you the bread from heaven, but my Father gives you the real bread from heaven. ³³ For the bread of God is the one who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." ³⁴ "Sir," they said to him, "give us this bread all the time!" ³⁵ "I am the Bread of Life," Jesus told them. "The one who comes to me will never be hungry, and the one who believes in me will never be thirsty.

⁴⁷ Amen, Amen, I tell you: The one who believes in me has eternal life. ⁴⁸ "I am the Bread of Life. ⁴⁹ Your fathers ate manna in the wilderness, and they died. ⁵⁰ This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that anyone may eat it and not die. ⁵¹ I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread, he will live forever. The bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

I like bread. Have you ever made bread at home from scratch? Whether its pizza dough, bread, or dinner rolls, (I'll even count cookies here,) there's something extra special about coming home, opening the door to the house and getting hit by the smell of fresh yeasty goodness. And then that first bite of that fresh from the oven creation.

As satisfying as a good bite of warm buttered bread is, it doesn't take long before the satisfying feelings of a full belly wears off. You get hungry again. Wouldn't it be awesome if there was something we could eat that would make us full forever and that would leave us with that full belly satisfied feeling? Everything we need would be in that bread; the sustenance to keep going and the strength we need to get things done.

Well, your Jesus talked once about a bread like that. Jesus spoke about it after a quiet night alone in the wilderness. He had gone to this wilderness after the miracle of feeding the 5,000 men (not counting the women and children) with just five loaves of bread and two fish. Following this miracle and these words, the Jewish people somehow were still asking for a sign, a bigger, better sign and after THAT one, they would believe in Him.

After all, they argued, their ancestors had manna, the miraculous flakes of bread-like food that were left after the dew had dried up. That is how God had fed them during their whole 40+ years of journeying and wandering in the time of Moses. That's the kind of food they thought was most important and if Jesus could provide that, they'd be satisfied.

One of the things that we often don't appreciate about God is that he always has something better in mind even if humans can't see past their immediate wants. Jesus reminded them that, yes, their ancestors were given manna. They were sustained by the hand of their gracious and loving God. But where were all those people now? Jesus pointed out, that they all died.

Things like food and drink, house and home for time on this earth are necessary and God provides them as he sees fit for each of us. But Jesus came to earth to offer us something even greater. Here Jesus is offering a different, better kind of bread. Here, Jesus offers the kind of Bread that when a person eats of it, that person will never die. Here Jesus, offers himself.

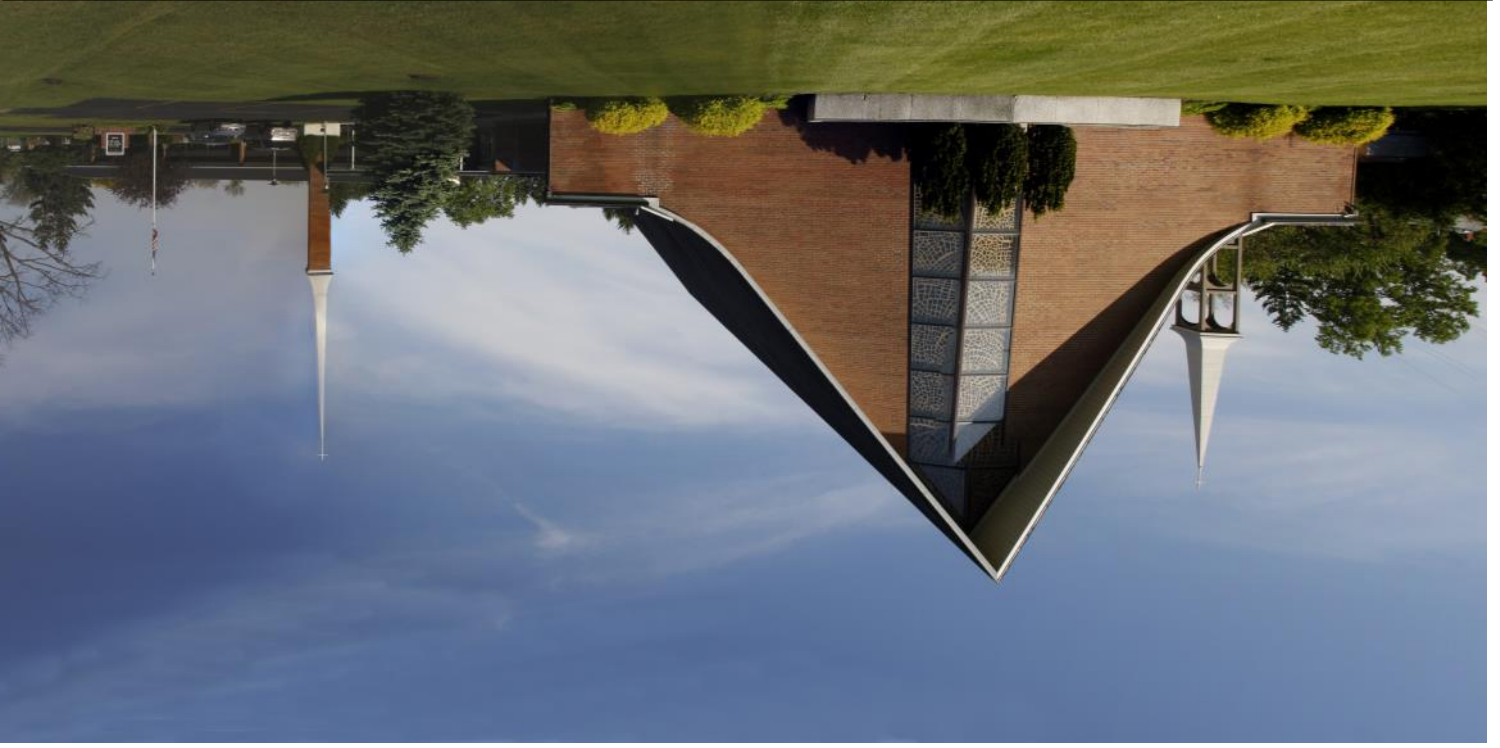
