¹Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us get rid of every burden and the sin that so easily ensnares us, and let us run with patient endurance the race that is laid out for us. ²Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who is the author of our faith and the one who brings it to its goal. In view of the joy set before him, he endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of God's throne. ³Carefully consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinful people, so that you do not grow weary and lose heart. ⁴You have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood in your fight against sin. ⁵Have you also forgotten the encouragement that addresses you as sons? My son, do not regard the Lord's discipline lightly, and do not become weary of his correction. ⁶For the Lord disciplines the one whom he loves, and he corrects every son he accepts ⁷Endure suffering as discipline. God is dealing with you as sons. Is there a son whose father does not discipline him? ⁸If you are not disciplined (and all of us have received it), then you are illegitimate children and not sons. ⁹In addition, we have earthly fathers who disciplined us, and we respected them. Should we not submit even more to the Father of the spirits and live? ¹⁰They disciplined us for a little while, according to what seemed best to them, but God disciplines us for our good, so that we may have a share in his holiness. ¹¹No discipline seems pleasant when it is happening, but painful, yet later it yields a peaceful harvest of righteousness for those who have been trained by it. Hebrews 12:1-11

THE PASSION HISTORY—HIS AND OURS

We have begun the season of Lent. During Lent we focus on the details of all that Jesus did to save sinners. The cross stands out as the altar of Christ's sacrifice. There are many symbols that remind us of Jesus' passion—30 pieces of silver, a rooster, a crown of thorns, and even the nails. No symbol surpasses the cross. For the cross was the ultimate instrument of Jesus' suffering and death.

Jesus' first disciples did not understand their Lord when he spoke to them of the cross. They did not realize that the cross and their "Teacher" belonged together, like a king and his crown. Still less, they understood that all His disciples attain life only through the cross. And they struggled to comprehend that our Lord doesn't spare His people wearisome suffering.

Our Lord's passion teaches us much. First and foremost, we learn of His infinite love for people through His complete sacrifice. Fundamentally, the foundation of our faith rests upon Jesus' redemptive work.

We know that the servant is not above the master. Jesus explained on Maundy Thursday to His disciples: *"In this world, you will have troubles,*

But take heart, I have overcome the world."

John 16:33b

Jesus' passion reminds us also that we are to expect to suffer as well. We are to understand and bear our personal crosses and sufferings. We expect this and should appreciate our personal passion history! Thus the admonition in Hebrews: "Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance that race marked out for us." The writer also exhorts us on where to fix our eyes in the time of trial. (*see Hebrews 12:2.*)

Notice that we begin by looking inside ourselves to our own sinful heart (v.1). In that way we begin to understand our bitterest foe—our sinfulness—and how to fight it. What suffering is there, after all, that we can accept without sin rebelling against it? The Christian who has had to fight the hottest battles in the times of testing can tell how the real sting of testing lies in the sin—filled reaches of our heart. Such a person knows how much courage it takes to fight this enemy in order to experience the blessing of cross and trial by conquering our personal sinfulness and sins.

Next we look into God's heart, and we learn the love of the Father in the chastisement of His children (vs. 5-11). This also helps us understand the promise: "*Where sin increased, grace increased all the more*" (Romans 5:20). A Christian is not above feeling pain, but they understand that His Father is allowing the passion to train His child to trust only in His promised strength and help.

Above all, we look at Christ's cross, remembering that the Author of our faith is also its Perfecter (vs.2-4). Patient trust is especially hard when sorrow lingers on. We are urged to look to our Savior. He is the field general, proceeding ahead of His troops; we merely follow where He has led. The God-Man fought and suffered far more than any other fighter or crossbearer. Through suffering, the Author of our salvation was made perfect (2:10), and His whole life was and is a perfect example of trust in His Father's gracious will and ways.

Finally, there parades before us that great cloud of witnesses who have conquered (v.1). Their victory inspires us to struggle and persevere. Christ, alone and forsaken by man and God, gathered through His redeeming struggle a huge group of the most wonderful witnesses—the patriarchs, the prophets, the martyrs. (see chapter 11). These all walked the thorn-filled path of faith, "people whom the world was not worthy." He has added to their ranks over the course of centuries all the pious New Testament crossbearers with their personal passion histories.

They didn't win on their own merit and worthiness but it was the Savior who glorified Himself and His Father through them. All of them, now brought to glory by their glorified Lord, urge us to persevere in the struggle, so that we may finally overcome in our personal passion history, just as they have overcome.

This Lenten season, may we study, treasure, and appreciate again Christ's passion history. In doing so, it will move us to . . .

## Principal's Report – March Zion Messenger

“My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. Jesus prayed these words in Gethsemane, just a little while before he was arrested, tried, unjustly condemned, and crucified. Jesus knew what was about to happen. He knew that it was necessary to complete God's plan of salvation. How amazing that there in the garden, almost 2000 years ago, he was thinking of us – those who would believe in him through the message brought from the apostles down through the ages to generation after generation of believers. Pastor Nathan Fager of St. Paul's, Monroe has graciously offered to assist us in directing this production. Our plan is to present the play outdoors. We also are planning our Biennial CEA Auction to be held outdoors the week prior to the musical, so a busy spring is coming up.

As our enrollment season opens, we have plans for not only our Kindergarten Round-up, but also classroom “roundups” where students who will be moving to a new classroom next year get a chance to experience their future classroom for a day. We hope to continue the growth started this year and are praying that God brings even more families to our doors this next school year. We encourage our congregation members to invite any friends or family who might be interested in Christian education to contact us and see what we have to offer.


