From the Pastors

It was a sad day. She was dying. And they could do nothing to stop it. Except... there were rumors that a rabbi from Nazareth was performing some amazing things. Rumors that he was able to cure diseases and he had not failed yet. So, they sent for him.

Then it got worse. Before the Rabbi arrived, someone interrupted and distracted the Rabbi. And then it was too late. She died. What kind of healer would stop in the middle of an emergency and forget to take care of someone?

But then, the day got better. She came back to life! (Matthew 9:18-26)

It was a sad day. He had died. He was the only one left in her life who took care of her in her old age, since her husband had already died some time before. There was only one thing to do: bury her son.

Then it got worse. On the way to the burial plot, someone stopped the funeral procession. What kind of person would insert himself in the middle of grief and pain? Who would dare to interrupt death?

But then, the day got so much better. He came back to life! (Luke 9:11-17)

It was a sad day. He was dying. His sisters sent word to their friend to come because they knew he could heal their brother. They had known him for a while and had seen how loving and willing he was to heal diseases.

Then it got worse. He died. Their friend hadn't come to save him. So, they buried him in a tomb. The place where the dead get laid. Why would he stay away? Why would he allow a hole to be torn in this family and allow death to win?

But then, after 4 days of mourning, it got better. He called their brother out of his four-day grave. He had come back to life! (John 11)

It was a sad day. He was arrested, illegally. He was put through a mockery of judicial justice. He was mocked because they assumed he was the most useless King this world has ever seen.

Then it got worse. They killed him. What kind of God allows this treatment? What kind of God dies? Gods are supposed to be powerful, striking fear into their enemies, able to thwart the most cunning enemies and crush them into the dust. Death swallowed Jesus.

But then everything got better for every single person. Because Jesus was the one person he should not have tried to swallow. Death had to spit him back out, because Jesus never forgets those he loves, Jesus dares to interrupt death, Jesus never lets death win. Jesus crushed Death and Satan just like he said he would.

He did it out of love for you. He did it to make sure Death doesn't win you. By giving himself over to the grave, he destroyed the grave's power over you. By rising back to life, he set the template of what he would do for all those he has claimed as his own. Now instead of death being the final thing that happens to a human, death for a Christian is the portal to waking up in the presence of the One who defeated Death.

So when Satan tries to scare you with death, whether it's your own or another's, say confidently with the Apostle Paul, "Death is swallowed up in victory. Death, where is your sting? Grave, where is your victory? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!" (1Cor 15:54-57)

This is what Easter means. It means that it is a good day now, and will be forever. Happy Resurrection Day!

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Ups and downs. Most everyone can describe their lives as having ups and downs.

For Jesus on his final week before his suffering, death, and resurrection, it was a week of ups and downs. Entering Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to the worship and adoration of crowds shouting "Hosanna!" ("Save us now!") To his intimate final Passover meal with his disciples on that Thursday, then a garden visit of fervent prayer ending in betrayal by a friend, an arrest, a mock trial and an undeserved death sentence, beating, scorn, and death by crucifixion. Yet a victory won for us — "It is finished.", and one Sunday later a glorious resurrection displaying Jesus victory over death.

What brought Jesus through it all was his singular purpose, the salvation of his people from sin – not just those alive in his time, but believers in God's promises throughout history, all the way down to you and I. This is evident in the words he prayed in Gethsemane:

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one— I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me." – John 17:20-23

Jesus knew what was about to happen. He knew that it was necessary to complete God's plan of salvation. How amazing that there in the garden, almost 2000 years ago, he was thinking of us – those who would believe in him through the message brought from the apostles down through the ages to generation after generation of believers.

15 Brothers, I am going to call your attention to the gospel that I preached to you. 
